

WHAT IS LOST?

Lost is a program to assist in identifying and locating community members who have been separated from their families or caretakers.

Individuals who suffer from Alzheimer's Disease, Autism, or other medical conditions which involve memory loss, confusion or are unable to communicate, may wander away from their home.

In these situations, police officers are called to assist in locating them. In addition, Officers may come across individuals who are lost but have not been reported as such.

Time is a critical factor in safely locating missing persons, especially in dangerous weather conditions.

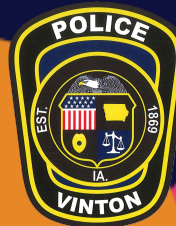
